- 1. CRA Resolution 2025/012 - A Resolution of the City of Deerfield Beach Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA), appointing Michael Chen to serve as the CRA Executive Director and Capital Projects Manager; approving and authorizing execution of an employment agreement with Mr. Chen; providing for an effective date.**

The Resolution was read by title only.

Anthony Soroka, City Attorney, provided a brief overview of the employment agreement. Thereafter, he stated that Mr. Chen has requested \$185,000 annually.

Mr. Hudak spoke in support of \$185,000 as Mr. Chen will be serving as the CRA Executive Director and Capital Projects Manager.

Mr. Plaut spoke in support of the employment agreement, as well as Mr. Chen's salary request of \$185,000.

Vice Chair Preston spoke in support of the employment agreement with Mr. Chen, as he has a wealth of knowledge and experience and is looking to make a difference. Thereafter, he agreed with the salary request.

Chair Drosky spoke in support of the employment agreement with Mr. Chen, as he has CRA management experience and a construction background. Further, he requested that Mr. Chen make the Marine Science Center his main priority. Thereafter, he agreed with the salary request.

Chair Drosky opened the public hearing.

Dan Herz, 330 SE 19th Avenue, Deerfield Beach, commented on Section 7 of the employment agreement.

MOTION was made by Mr. Hudak, seconded by Vice Chair Preston, to approve Item 1, adopted CRA Resolution 2025/012, at an annual salary of \$185,000.00. Roll Call:

DISTRICT 3

Community Policing - Mr. Shanetzky stated that police presence is from 6:00 a.m. to midnight, which is concerning; therefore, he suggested that it be extended to 4:00 a.m. at the beach and in the Cove area.

In response to Chair Drosky's question, Mr. Shanetzky replied that he spoke to the City Manager today regarding the community policing program.

In response to Chair Drosky's question, Rodney Brimlow, City Manager, replied that the hours were approved by the CRA Board in conjunction with the District Chief, whereby, the hours were based on input from BSO. Thereafter, he provided a brief overview of the community policing hours and areas.

Mr. Shanetzky requested that the community policing program be added to the next agenda.

Parking Garage - Mr. Shanetzky expressed concerns with the lack of lights and requested that additional lighting be installed.

BOARD COMMENTS - CONTINUED

In response to Chair Drosky's question, Mr. Brimlow said one of the lights was fixed today and the other requires a special fabricated bracket, which should be completed within the next couple weeks. Additionally, he said staff is looking into adding bollards to the westside of the area.

Mr. Hudak stated that the hours for the community policing program were revised due to the dramatic cost increase; therefore, it is a budgetary item. Further, he said the request for additional bollards was previously discussed.

Mr. Shanetzky expressed concerns with the current hours of the community policing program, as additional presence is needed after midnight. Further, he said the turtle friendly bollards are not needed near the parking garage. Additionally, he stated that there are lights out at the Cove Shopping Center entrance. Lastly, he's received complaints about the beach not being clean.

Vice Chair Preston said the hours for the community policing program have been discussed; nonetheless, if Mr. Shanetzky is amenable, staff can work with Captain Hofstein to see if additional adjustments are warranted and bring them back to the Board for discussion.

Mr. Shanetzky agreed.

Mr. Brimlow stated that staff will provide the Board with the minutes regarding the community policing program.

CRA Staff Location - In response to Mr. Shanetzky's question, Mr. Brimlow replied that CRA offices will be located in the new facility, once completed.

Beach Area - Mr. Plaut said he walked along the beach area this morning and it was immaculate.

DISTRICT 2

International Fishing Pier - Vice Chair Preston said he has received numerous phone calls regarding the reopening of the pier. Thereafter, he thanked Mr. Hudak for his recommendation of waiving the entrance fees until January 1, 2026.

Thereafter, he commented on the 300-space parking garage at the Cove Shopping Center, as well as the 8-story hotel purchased by Lou Moshakos, and asked if the ground breaking will occur before the CRA sunsets.

Recommended Action

CRA Board to approve Resolution

Background/History

The Management Agreement (Agreement) between the City/CRA and New World Aquarium, Inc. (NWA), an affiliated entity of MODS, was adopted on July 8, 2025 under CRA Resolution No. 2025/006. Section 2.1 of the Agreement states that NWA is responsible to “diligently pursue fundraising activities” for the Center Exhibits.

The anticipation of this grant was discussed in the December 10, 2024 CRA Meeting, as part of the adoption of CRA Resolution No. 2024/014 regarding an interlocal agreement associated with the FIND Grant, which was unanimously approved.

On December 15, 2025, the CRA received the Grant Award Agreement from the Broward County Cultural Division.

Current Activity

Approval for the Cultural Arts grant will be before the Board of County Commissioners at their January 22, 2026 County Commission meeting.

The Grant award is for \$500,000.00. The draft Agreement was sent to the CRA Attorney for review and has been approved, in form, for execution. The Grant requires a two-to-one cash matching requirement (a minimum of \$1,000,000.00 in matching funds).

Recommendation

If approved, the proceeds from this grant will serve as a supplement to the construction costs of the Marine Science Center and its interior exhibition space, thereby reducing the funding required from the City, CRA, and NWA/MODS.

CRA RESOLUTION NO. 2026/

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF DEERFIELD BEACH COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY (CRA), APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF A GRANT AWARD AGREEMENT WITH BROWARD COUNTY FOR THE MARINE SCIENCE CENTER AT SULLIVAN PARK; AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF THE BROWARD COUNTY CULTURAL DIVISION GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$500,000.00; ACKNOWLEDGING THE AVAILABILITY OF MATCHING FUNDS IN THE MINIMUM AMOUNT OF \$1,000,000.00; PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTATION AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, at the December 10, 2024 CRA Board Meeting, the CRA Board was advised of a grant opportunity through the Broward County Cultural Division (the “Cultural Grant”) that could provide financial assistance for the Marine Science Center facility currently being constructed at Sullivan Park (the “Marine Science Center”), and the CRA Board expressed support for pursuing the Cultural Grant; and

WHEREAS, the CRA, in conjunction with The New World Aquarium, Inc. (Manager of the Marine Science Center), applied to the Broward County Cultural Division for a \$500,000.00 Cultural Grant to support the Marine Science Center (the “Grant”); and

WHEREAS, the CRA was notified that the Grant in the amount of \$500,000 has been awarded subject to execution of a grant award agreement, and the CRA received the Grant Award Agreement with Broward County, attached and incorporated herein as Exhibit “1”, (the “Grant Agreement”) that is necessary to effectuate the Grant award for the Marine Science Center; and

WHEREAS, the Grant Agreement provides for the Grant in the amount of \$500,000.00 to be paid out on a reimbursement basis and requires a two-to-one cash match with a minimum of \$1,000,000 in matching funds to be spent (the “Matching Funds Requirement”); and

WHEREAS, CRA staff has confirmed that the CRA is able to meet the Matching Funds Requirement; and

WHEREAS, the CRA Board finds that it is in the best interest of the CRA to approve and authorize the execution of the Grant Agreement with Broward County, attached as Exhibit “1”, and accept the Grant in the amount of \$500,000.00, and hereby acknowledges availability of the required matching funds in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000.00 to satisfy the Matching Funds Requirement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF DEERFIELD BEACH COMMUNITY REDEVELOPEMENT AGENCY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The above referenced “Whereas” clauses are true and correct and made a part of this Resolution.

Section 2. The Grant Agreement with Broward County, attached as Exhibit “1”, is hereby approved. The CRA is authorized to accept the Grant in the amount of \$500,000.00 and hereby acknowledges availability of the required matching funds in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000.00 to satisfy the Matching Funds Requirement.

Section 3. The CRA Executive Director is authorized to execute the Grant Agreement with Broward County, attached as Exhibit “1”, together with such non-substantial changes as are acceptable to the CRA Executive Director and approved as to form and legal sufficiency by the CRA Attorney.

Section 4. The appropriate CRA officials are authorized to do all things necessary and expedient to carry out the aims of this Resolution, including but not limited to taking the necessary actions to adhere to the Grant requirements and the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement.

Section 5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

BROWARD COUNTY CULTURAL DIVISION GRANT AWARD AGREEMENT

This Broward County Cultural Division Grant Award Agreement ("Grant Agreement") is made and entered into by and between Broward County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida ("County"), and the City of Deerfield Beach Community Redevelopment Agency, a public body corporate and politic created pursuant to Chapter 163, Part III, Florida Statutes ("Recipient"). County and Recipient are individually referred to as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

For good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Recipient has been awarded a Broward County Cultural Division Grant ("Grant Award") in the category indicated below ("Grant Program") in accordance with the Broward County Administrative Code ("Administrative Code") or as otherwise authorized by the Board of County Commissioners:
