GENERAL ITEMS

1. Update by the Museum of Discovery and Science (MODS) regarding the exhibits and programming for the Marine Science Center.

Joe Cox, President and CEO, highlighted a brief PowerPoint presentation. Thereafter, he stated that JM Family Enterprises has made a \$1 million commitment to support the facility.

Mr. Hudak expressed his excitement about the project. Thereafter, he recommended naming the facility the Museum of Discovery and Science Deerfield Beach Naturium, Sponsored by JMFE. He has asked that the City Attorney look into trademarking Naturium.

Mr. Cox spoke in support of the uniqueness and stated that they will test the name recognition; nonetheless, if it does not work for the building, he recommended using it within an exhibit.

Mr. Plaut thanked everyone involved, as this facility will be a spectacular addition to the City.

Mr. Shanetzky recommended adding a video porthole that connects to the top of the pier and museum, so visitors in the museum can see the visitors on the pier.

In response to Mr. Cox's question, Mr. Hudak replied that the porthole near the pier is currently inoperable, but staff is working diligently to get it reconnected to the underwater camera.

In response to Mr. Shanetzky's question, Mr. Cox replied that he is unsure of the exact date for finalization; however, once established, the Board will be advised.

Vice Chair Preston thanked Mr. Cox for the relationship that has been established. Thereafter, he expressed excitement for the project, and encouraged Mr. Cox to continue bringing forth ideas.

Chair Drosky thanked Mr. Cox for his efforts, as well as the relationship the City has established with MODS. Thereafter, he briefly commented on the name selections, and recommended Deerfield Beach MODS Nature Center, as it incorporates all categories.

In response to Chair Drosky's question, Mr. Cox replied that MODS is working with a company to ensure that the AI-generated responses from the shark are appropriate. Thereafter, he said the technology will be tested on an AI otter at MODS.

Chair Drosky recommended incorporating coyotes into an exhibit, as there are many misconceptions about them.

Mr. Cox said they have already done the research on coyotes, so it can be included. Thereafter, he thanked the Board for all of their efforts during this process.

2. Presentation by Guy Harvey Inc. regarding the Marine Science Center Murals.

Tonya Shearer, Director of Strategic Partnerships, presented a PowerPoint outlining the two art installations planned for the exterior of Sullivan Park, as well as the art installations for Deerfield Island Park. Thereafter, she commented on the Guy Harvey Conservation Education Program, which provides teachers with field trip grants. Dr. Shearer explained that the Guy Harvey Foundation is partnering with Broward County to bring educational stations to Deerfield Island Park; and although, they are two separate facilities, the goal is to make the content on the Island complementary to Sullivan Park.

3. CRA Resolution 2026/002 - A Resolution of the City of Deerfield Beach Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA), approving an agreement with the Guy Harvey Foundation for the design, creation and installation of the two murals at the Marine Science Center at Sullivan Park with the design and creation of the murals at no cost to the CRA; approving the expenditure of \$4,199.75 for installation costs and the expenditure of funds to rent the necessary lifts or cranes for the installation; providing for execution, implementation and an effective date. (Funds from Account #190-500-520-5200-000-55200-506304 - Infrastructure and Capital Improvements)

Michael Chen, CRA Director, stated that, if approved, the art installations will go to the Public Art Committee for their review and approval.

Mr. Hudak thanked the Guy Harvey Foundation for their efforts.

Chair Drosky opened the public hearing; however, there were none to speak and the public hearing was closed.

Budget Workshop - Mr. Chen requested that a workshop be held, so he can gain better knowledge of the Board's priorities and objectives. If the Board doesn't feel a workshop is warranted, he asked that it be discussed at the next regular CRA meeting.

Marine Science Center at Sullivan Park - Mr. Chen said the building itself should be completed by the end of April; therefore, he requested building names be discussed at the next meeting.

Background/History

Construction started on the marine science center building in September 2024. The CRA and Economic Development Department offices will move into and be permanently located in the building upon its completion. The costs of the upcoming move, furnishings, and furniture assembly/set up of the new offices for the CRA and the common areas were not provided for in the FY2026 CRA budget.

Current Activity

The construction completion and Certificate of Occupancy of the building is expected by May 1, 2026. The CRA and Economic Development Department offices are currently located in the on-site construction trailers. The trailers will be removed from the site by March 30, 2026 to accommodate the paving and landscaping of the center's parking lot by the May 1, 2026 completion date. To ensure the removal of the trailers in a timely manner, staff will vacate the trailer offices by or before March 20, 2026. CRA/ED staff will work remotely between the time of vacating the trailers and until the new offices are available for occupancy, targeted for May 1, 2026. To have the offices set up and move-in ready by that date, the CRA must order the furniture by March 16, 2026.

Recommendation

Staff recommends CRA Board approval of the proposed costs of moving, furnishings, and furniture assembly/set up of the new CRA offices and common areas and a budget transfer of \$60,000 to appropriate funding to cover those costs.

CRA RESOLUTION NO. 2026/

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF DEERFIELD BEACH COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY, AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE EXPENDITURE OF AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$60,000.00 FOR THE PURCHASE AND DELIVERY OF FURNITURE AND FURNISHINGS IN CONNECTION WITH THE CRA’S OFFICE SPACE AND THE COMMON AREAS TO BE LOCATED AT THE NEW SULLIVAN PARK FACILITY AND RELATED MOVING EXPENSES; AUTHORIZING A BUDGET TRANSFER WITHIN THE CRA FUND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$60,000.00 FROM THE OTHER CONTRACTUAL SERVICES LINE ITEM TO THE MATERIALS TO MAINTAIN BUILDING LINE ITEM; PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTATION AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the CRA Board previously directed CRA staff to provide for the design of the proposed new facility at Sullivan Park to accommodate a potential marine science to expand the experience of children and families while visiting Sullivan Park (the “Sullivan Park Facility”); and

WHEREAS, the CRA Board previously approved a construction contract for construction of the Sullivan Park Facility, and the construction is anticipated to be completed by May 1, 2026; and

WHEREAS, CRA staff are currently working out of a construction trailer while the Sullivan Park Facility is under construction, and the CRA’s offices are planned to be relocated to the first floor of the Sullivan Park Facility upon completion of the construction; and

WHEREAS, the new CRA offices and the common areas of the first floor of the Sullivan Park Facility will require furniture and furnishings; and

WHEREAS, CRA staff recommends the CRA Board authorize and approve the expenditure of an amount not to exceed \$60,000.00 for the purchase and delivery of furniture and furnishings in connection with the CRA’s office space and the common areas to be located at the Sullivan Park Facility and for related moving expenditures (collectively, the “Furniture Purchases”), and authorize a budget transfer in the amount of \$60,000.00 from the Other Contractual Services Line Item to the Materials to Maintain Building Line Item (the “Budget Transfer”) to appropriate funding for the Furniture Purchases.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF DEERFIELD BEACH COMMUNITY REDEVELOPEMENT AGENCY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The above referenced “Whereas” clauses are true and correct and made a part of this Resolution.

Section 2. The CRA Board hereby authorizes and approves the Furniture Purchases for the Sullivan Park Facility in an amount not to exceed \$60,000.00.

Section 3. The CRA Board hereby approves the Budget Transfer in the amount of \$60,000.00 from the Other Contractual Services Line Item to the Materials to Maintain Building Line Item to appropriate funding for the Furniture Purchases.

Section 4. The appropriate CRA officials are authorized to do all things necessary to carry out the aims of this Resolution, including all actions required to effectuate the Budget Transfer.

Section 5. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.

Discussion and direction regarding CRA Community Policing Program deputy detail service times.

Recommended Action

CRA Board to provide direction to staff

Background/History

At the December 2024 CRA meeting, staff presented the CRA Board with three levels of service options to address the rate increase for the CRA Community Policing Deputy Detail. Staff noted the CRA Board's input on the options and worked with BSO and the City Manager to create a proposed level of service and staffing plan that best meets CRA Board input and community policing goals and objectives. The proposed level of service and staffing plan was approved by the CRA Board on February 11, 2025 via approval of CRA Resolution No. 2025/002 (enclosed).

Current Activity

With the opening of new restaurants in the CRA and particularly along the "S-Curve" district, it was suggested that the CRA provide enhanced level of service for the patrons and service staff of the restaurants closing later in the night, specifically to extend the current schedule to provide deputy patrols until 2:00 am on the weekends.

Staff met with Captain Hofstein and Sean Gladioux, Public Safety Director, to discuss the options available to expand the level of service at night from midnight to 2:00 am. Two options were proposed: (A) Add two hours for two patrolmen every day for the year, or (B) "Slide" the patrol hours to start two hours later and end two hours later. Option A would have a cost impact, while Option B would have no cost impact. According to BSO records, there were no significant crimes reported in the 7:00 am to 8:00 am timespan of the shift. It was decided to temporarily try the 8:00 am to 2:00 am schedule on a trial basis.

Recommendation

Staff requests direction on the potential modification of the CRA Community Policing Deputy Detail Service Times.

CRA RESOLUTION NO. 2025/002

A RESOLUTION OF THE DEERFIELD BEACH COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY (CRA), APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING A MODIFICATION AND INCREASE TO THE BROWARD SHERIFF OFFICE’S LEVEL OF SERVICE FOR COMMUNITY POLICING DEPUTY DETAIL IN THE AMOUNT OF \$60,000.00; AUTHORIZING A BUDGET TRANSFER WITHIN THE CRA FUND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$60,000.00 FROM THE INFRASTRUCTURE AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT LINE ITEM TO THE COMMUNITY POLICING LINE ITEM; PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTATION, EXECUTION AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, on August 27, 2024, the CRA Board approved the Fiscal Year 2025 CRA Budget that included \$50,000.00 in funding for the CRA Community Policing Program (the “Program”); and

WHEREAS, the Program offers an enhanced level of security for projects and areas improved by the CRA; and

WHEREAS, the Program’s Deputy Detail was charged at a rate of \$45.00 per hour during the last fiscal year, and at the October 8, 2024 CRA Meeting, CRA staff requested Board direction regarding the Program, and the recent BSO increase in the hourly rate of deputies to \$74.00 per hour; and

WHEREAS, at the December 10, 2024 CRA Board meeting, CRA staff presented the Board with three (3) level of service options to address the rate increase for the Program and the Board provided input regarding the desired level of service; and

WHEREAS, at the February 11, 2025 CRA Board meeting, CRA staff recommended a Community Policing Level of Service that provides community policing coverage throughout the weekend, including Friday and Saturday evening service, along with complete coverage throughout the day on Saturdays and Sundays, with the understanding that BSO will generally adhere to this schedule but will periodically reallocate resources in response to special situations such as holidays, spring break, special events and weather conditions, for an additional cost of \$60,000.00, as set forth in Exhibit “A” (the “Modified Level of Service”); and

WHEREAS, CRA staff recommends that the CRA Board approve Modified Service and authorize a budget transfer in the amount of \$60,000.00 from the Infrastructure and Capital Improvement Line Item to the Community Policing Line Item (the “Budget Transfer”) to appropriate funding for the increased cost for the Modified Level of Service.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF DEERFIELD BEACH COMMUNITY REDEVELOPEMENT AGENCY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The above referenced “Whereas” clauses are true and correct and made a part of this Resolution.

Section 2. The CRA hereby approves the Modified Level of Service for the Program as set forth in Exhibit “A”, in an increased amount not to exceed \$60,000.00.

Section 3. The CRA Board hereby approves the Budget Transfer in the amount of \$60,000.00 from the Infrastructure and Capital Improvement Line Item to the Community Policing Line Item to appropriate funding for the increased cost of the Modified Level of Service for the Program.

Section 4. The appropriate CRA officials are authorized to do all things necessary to carry out the aims of this Resolution, including all actions required to effectuate the Budget Transfer.

Section 5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

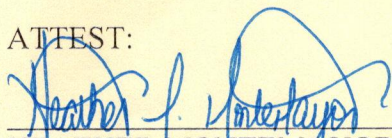
