Virtual Special City Commission Meeting - May 12, 2020

DEERFIELD BEACH – YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED that a **Special City Commission** meeting regarding the Fourth of July Event will be held on **Tuesday, May 12, 2020, at 6:30 PM** **utilizing communications media technology** with elected officials and City staff participating through video conferencing.

On March 20, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-69, suspending any Florida Statute that requires a quorum to be present in person or requires a local government body to meet at a specific public place. The Order further allows for local government bodies to utilize communications media technology, such as telephonic and video conferencing. The order was extended by virtue of Executive Order 20-112 effective May 4, 2020.

Background/History

The City hosts the Annual Fourth of July Celebration and Fireworks Show. The event has historically drawn between 85,000 to 95,000 attendees. In consideration of the COVID-19 pandemic, declaration of a public health emergency, emergency orders and CDC guidelines for social distancing, and the current closure of South Florida beaches, the City Manager is recommending cancellation of this event.

The final determination for canceling this event and the timing of that cancellation has cost implications.

Resolution 2020/ - A Resolution of the City Commission of the City of Deerfield Beach, Florida, extending the State of Local Emergency regarding COVID-19 until June 17, 2020; authorizing the City Manager to take appropriate actions; providing an effective date.

Background/History

On March 9, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-52, declaring a State of Emergency in the State of Florida due to Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 ("COVID-19"). On March 13, 2020, the Mayor issued Executive Order 2020-01, declaring a state of local emergency in the City of Deerfield Beach.

Section 30-28 of the City Code provides that the maximum period of any state of local emergency declared by the Mayor shall be 7 days, but the City Commission may extend the state of local emergency for an additional period of up to 30 days with no further extensions provided for in the City Code. On March 17, 2020, the City Commission adopted Resolution 2020/336, extending the state of local emergency until April 17, 2020.

As of today, the City is aware of confirmed cases of COVID-19 within its jurisdictional boundaries, the confirmed cases in the County are increasing daily and the United States now has more total reported confirmed cases than any other country.

On April 7, 2020, the City Commission adopted an emergency ordinance to provide for further extensions of the state of local emergency for periods of up to 30 days each (the "Emergency Ordinance"). On April 7, 2020, the City Commission extended the State of Local Emergency until May 17, 2020.

The City Manager has issued Emergency Orders, including Amended and Restated Emergency Order 2020-04 announcing a Safer at Home order for City residents, to deal with the emergency and mitigate the harm posed by COVID-19 as referenced therein and as further described in County, State, and Federal declarations concerning COVID-19.

On April 28, 2020, the Broward County Administrator issued Emergency Order 20-08, providing for the limited reopening of certain parks, natural areas, boat ramps, marinas, golf courses, and certain pools and other amenities in Broward County.

On April 29, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-112, providing for Phase 1 for the reopening of Florida, but excluding Broward County from the limited reopening of restaurants and retail at 25%. On April 29, 2020, the City Manager issued Emergency Order 2020-06, adopting Broward County Emergency Order 20-08 and implementing additional regulations for the partial Phase 1 of reopening.

On May 8, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-114, extending the State of Local Emergency in the State of Florida for 60 days.

Current Activity

Due to the continued evolving nature of COVID-19, Federal and State orders, CDC recommendations concerning public gatherings, and the increasing local confirmed cases, City staff recommends that the City Commission further extend the State of Local Emergency until June 17, 2020.

Recommendation

Staff recommends approval.

RESOLUTION NO. 2020/

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DEERFIELD BEACH, FLORIDA, EXTENDING THE STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY REGARDING COVID-19 UNTIL JUNE 17, 2020; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (“COVID-19”) is a severe acute respiratory illness that can spread among humans through respiratory transmission and presents with symptoms similar to those of influenza; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-52 declaring a State of Emergency in the State of Florida due to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Section 30-28 of the City of Deerfield Beach Code of Ordinances (the “City Code”) empowers the Mayor to declare a state of local emergency by executive order if the Mayor finds that an emergency, as defined in Section 252.34, Fla. Stat., has occurred in the City or that the threat thereof is imminent; and

WHEREAS, Section 252.34(4), Fla. Stat., defines an “emergency” to mean “any occurrence, or threat thereof, whether natural, technological, or manmade, in war or in peace, which results or may result in substantial injury or harm to the population or substantial damage to or loss of property”; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 poses an imminent threat that may result in substantial injury or harm to the population; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the Mayor issued an Executive Order declaring a State of Local Emergency in the City of Deerfield Beach (the “State of Local Emergency”); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 30-28 of the City Code, the maximum period of any state of local emergency declared by the Mayor shall be 7 days, but the City Commission may extend the state of local emergency for an additional period of up to 30 days; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, the City Commission extended the State of Local Emergency until April 17, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the City is aware of confirmed cases of COVID-19 within its jurisdictional boundaries, the confirmed cases within Broward County are increasing daily, and the United States now has more total reported confirmed cases than any other country; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager has issued Emergency Orders to deal with the emergency and mitigate the harm posed by COVID-19 as referenced therein and as further described in County, State, and Federal declarations concerning COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2020, the City Manager issued Emergency Order 2020-04, announcing a Safer at Home order for City residents; and

WHEREAS, on April 1, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-91, requiring all persons in Florida to limit their movements and personal interactions outside of their home to only those necessary to obtain or provide essential services or conduct essential activities; and

WHEREAS, based on the continued evolving nature of COVID-19, Federal and State orders, CDC recommendations concerning public gatherings, and the increasing local confirmed cases, the City Commission desires to further extend the State of Local Emergency; and

WHEREAS, on April 7, 2020, the City Commission adopted an emergency ordinance to provide for further extensions of the state of local emergency for periods of up to 30 days each (the “Emergency Ordinance”); and

WHEREAS, on April 7, 2020, the City Commission extended the State of Local Emergency until May 17, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on April 28, 2020, the Broward County Administrator issued Emergency Order 20-08, providing for the limited reopening of certain parks, natural areas, boat ramps, marinas, golf courses, and certain pools and other amenities in Broward County; and

WHEREAS, on April 29, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-112, providing for Phase 1 for the reopening of Florida, but excluding Broward County from the limited reopening of restaurants and retail at 25% capacity; and

WHEREAS, on April 29, 2020, the City Manager issued Emergency Order 2020-06, adopting Broward County Emergency Order 20-08 and implementing additional regulations for the partial Phase 1 of reopening; and

WHEREAS, on May 8, 2020, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-114, extending the State of Emergency in the State of Florida for 60 days; and

WHEREAS, due to the evolving nature of the COVID-19 emergency, the City Commission deems it in the best interest of the City to further extend the State of Local Emergency until June 17, 2020.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DEERFIELD BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The above referenced “Whereas” clauses are true and correct and made a part hereof.

Section 2. Pursuant to Section 30-28 of the City Code and the Emergency Ordinance, the

City Commission hereby extends the State of Local Emergency until June 17, 2020, unless terminated earlier by a vote of four members of the City Commission.

Section 3. The City Manager is hereby authorized to do all things necessary to prepare the City for the State of Local Emergency and to respond to the emergency, including but not limited to exercising the City Manager's emergency powers provided for in Section 30-29 of the City Code.

Section 4. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
